The West Virginia Music Teachers Association sanctioned a concerto competition and festival to provide needed performance and ensemble opportunities for piano students in the Eastern Panhandle and across the state. Founded by Dr. Scott Beard, (NCTM), the competition is named for Judith Siegel and Helen Hoffmann, two of his former teachers who stressed the importance of ensemble music, especially concerti.

*Prizes: Junior: \$25 Intermediate: \$50 Senior: \$100/\$50

Eligibility:

All students who study with a member of WVMTA are eligible to enter. The Junior category runs through 8th grade; Intermediate through 10th grade and Senior through the college level for the competitive categories.

Audition Procedure:

For the competitive category, all selections must be memorized. One original copy of the music is sufficient. Music from internet sites (where noted in competition repertoire) is acceptable. Measures must be numbered at the beginning of each system. Evaluation areas: Interpretation and overall artistic effect. A winner in each category will be selected solely on the basis of the audition performance. The decision of the judges is final. Students must secure their own accompanist for the competition.

Non-competitive category:

Students may play any concerto movement or movements, up to 5 minutes in duration. Students will receive comments from the judges and an overall rating. Students will receive performance points for this event. *Please note that there is an additional entry fee for each movement performed.*

Competitive Category:

Students may play choose one or more movements up to a total duration of 10 minutes. The judge(s) will select anywhere from 1-3 students to perform with the orchestra. *Please note that there is an additional entry fee for each movement performed.*
